Amazing Río Secreto



Imagine finding a hole in the ground and lowering yourself into the unknown where you uncover a breathtaking underground world untouched for thousands of years. Since then, Río Secreto has become a protected nature reserve where you can safely explore the Yucatan Peninsula's most awe-inspiring underground-universe. Learn about this ancient, magical subterranean world that until recently had remained unexplored for millions of years.

Expedition Times: Daily 9:00am, 10:00am, 11:00am, noon and 1:00pm. Tour is broken down into smaller groups of 10 people each.

Details of the tour:

1. Arrival to Río Secreto where there will be a brief video about the discovery of the caves and safety instructions.
2. Transfer to the actual entrance of the caves, where the guides will:
 - Brief visitors regarding site attractions, usage and safety.
 - Provide visitors with all appropriate clothing and equipment.
3. Visitors will then be guided on a 1 and ½ hour tour, walking and swimming along the route.
4. A light lunch will be provided along with bottled water and fruit punch.

Once the guests have seen the village and lounged at the Market (cocktail area) they will be invited by the Mayan warriors to go into the dining area. After dinner the guests will enjoy truly ancient performances representing centuries of traditions exposing some of the magic of the mystic Mayan culture.

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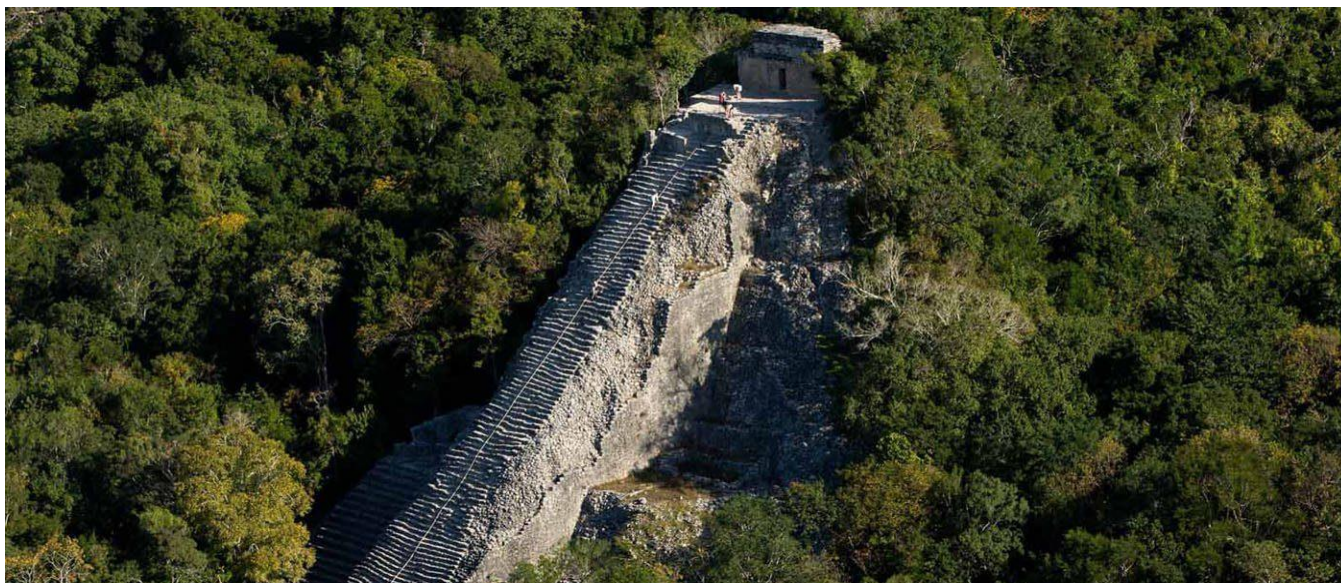

Private Half Day Excursion to Cobá with lunch on the beach



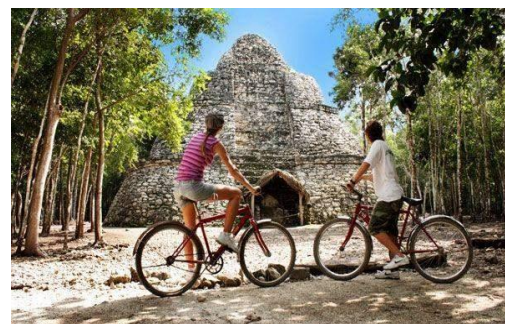
Visit the archaeological site of Cobá, and discover the amazing Nohoch Muul pyramid, the tallest in the Yucatan Peninsula from where you will have stunning views of the jungle (the only large ruin left in the state of Quintana Roo one can climb onto!). The Mexican National Institute of Anthropology & History began minor archeological excavations in 1972. It is said that only 10% of the site has been cleared from the jungle and restored by archaeologists. Bikes are available to cycle around the vast area that once made up one of the largest cities of the Pre-Columbian Maya civilization.

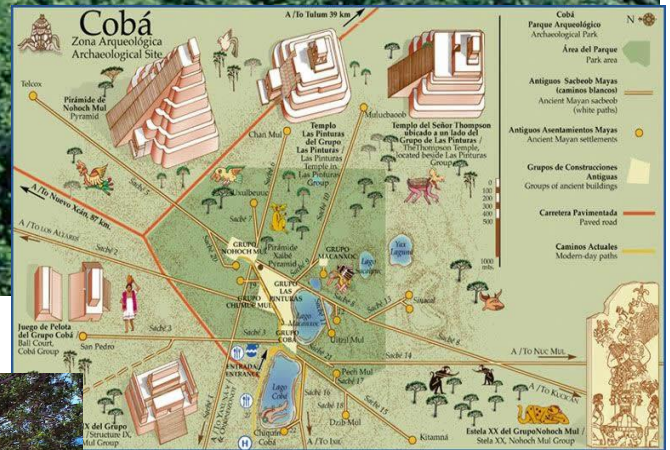
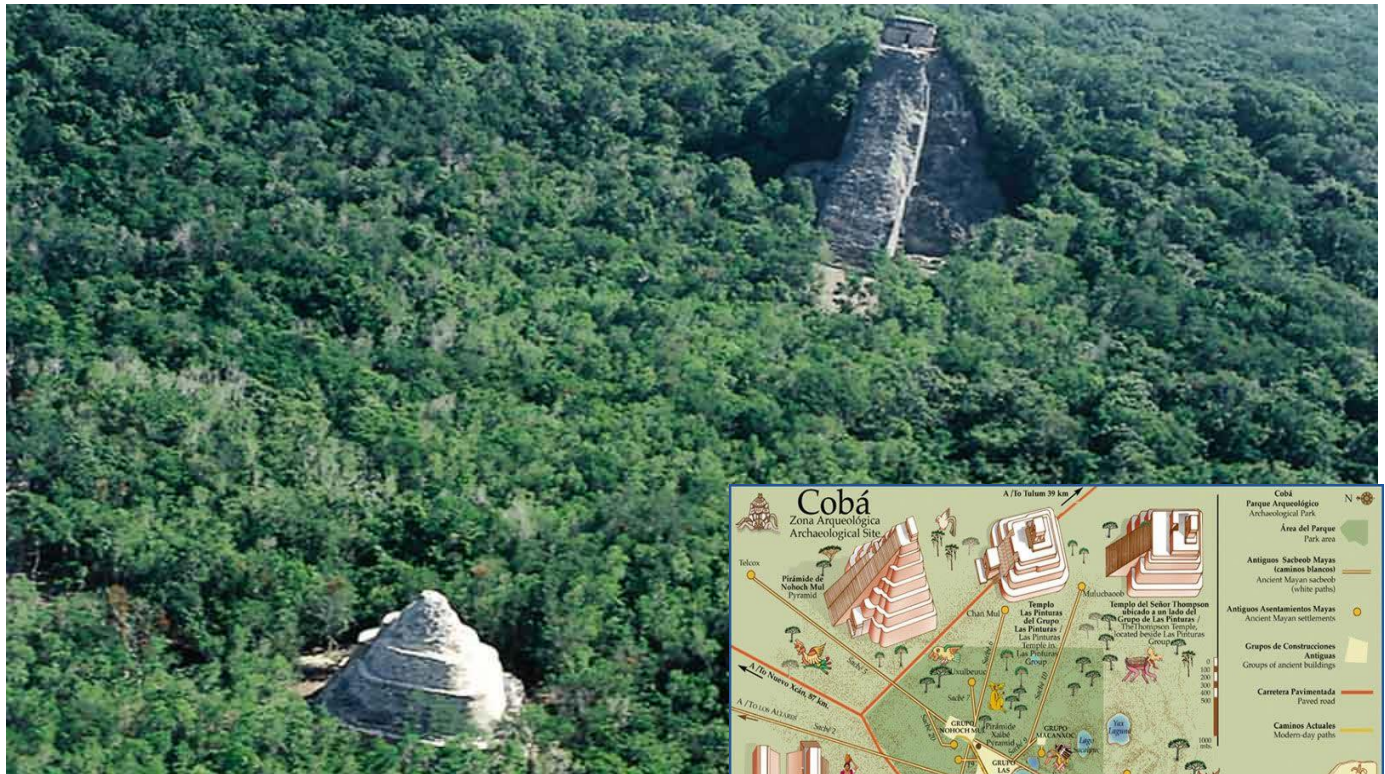
